  2. **The Chair** leads an examination of the **Applicant's case**. First, the panel may ask questions and then the Chair invites Responsible and Interested Parties to participate. Questions may only relate to the points made by the applicant.
  3. **The Representors/Respondents** (and responsible and Interested Parties) then state their case.
  4. **The Chair** leads an examination of the **Representor's case**.

Each party will be given an equal maximum period of time in which to present their case and may, if given permission by the Chair, question any other party.

## **REVIEW OF PREMISES LICENCE – Alcohol & Gambling Licensing Sub-Committee Thursday 21 February 2019**

### **1.0 Purpose of Report**

- 1.1 To consider a request from Northamptonshire Police for the Review of the Premises Licence for Level 4 (Passion) 39 Sheep Street, Northampton NN1 2NE.

### **2.0 Summary**

- 2.1 The review application was received on the 4 January 2019 and submitted in accordance with licensing objective(s) for:

- The Prevention of Crime and Disorder; and,
- Protection of Children from harm.

A copy of the application is attached (**Appendix A**).

- 2.2 The current licence holder is Akhtar Janjua, 21 Marriott Street, Northampton NN2 6AW. The premises licence is recorded as PL0546 (**Appendix B**).

### **3.0 Consultations/Representations**

- 3.1 When a request for the review of a premises licence or club premises certificate is received, the licensing authority must display a notice at or near the premises, and on the council's website. This gives responsible authorities and any other interested parties a 28 day period for the opportunity to make representations in relation to the review application. It is the responsibility of the applicant to serve a copy of the review application onto the licence holder and the responsible authorities.

- 3.2 The local authority displayed the obligatory notice on the 5 January 2019. (**Appendix C**).

- 3.3 During the 28 day period no representations have been received.

### **4.0 Attendance**

- 4.1 The local authority is required to request confirmation of attendance from all interested parties. The following have confirmed attendance at today's hearing;

To date the licence holder has not confirmed if he will attending and there has not been any notification from a representative acting on behalf of the licence holder.

## **6.0 History of Premises & Licence Holder**

- 6.1 Mr Akhtar Janjua became the licence holder of Level 4 (Passion) Premises Licence PL0546 on the 24 November 2005 and the Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) on the same date. The premises was previously licensed as a Public Entertainment venue from 5 April 2003 until 4 April 2005, Mr Janjua was the applicant for this licence. According to licensing records the premises was unlicensed between April and November 2005.
- 6.2 The premises licence for Level 4 (Passion) was suspended on 31 March 2014 for non-payment of annual fees but this suspension was lifted on 17 April 2014 following payment of the outstanding fees.
- 6.3 Mr Janjua first became a Personal Alcohol Licence Holder (PA0770) and was issued with this licence on 29 November 2005. He is not currently the licence holder and/or DPS for any other premises within this local authority area. We do not have information to confirm if he is the licence holder/DPS for any premises within a different licensing area.

## **7.0 Options**

- 7.1 At the end of the consultation period the licensing authority must hold a hearing. It must take such steps as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives, which are:
  - the prevention of crime and disorder;

- public safety;
- the prevention of public nuisance; and,
- the protection of children from harm.

The steps the Sub-Committee can take are to:

- to modify the conditions of the licence;
- to exclude a licensable activity from the licence;
- to remove the designated premises supervisor;
- to suspend the licence for a period not exceeding 3 months; and/or,
- to revoke the licence.

- 7.2 For the purpose of a) above, the conditions are modified if any of them are altered or omitted or a new condition is added. Further, if the Sub-committee takes either of the steps at a) or b) above it may provide that the step only has effect for a limited period of up to 3 months.

## **8.0 Policy Considerations**

- 8.1 Northampton Borough Council Statement of Licensing Policy;  
Sections 18 and 19 give guidance in relation to this application.

- 8.2 s.182 Guidance Licensing Act 2003;  
Section 11 gives guidance for determination of this application.

Subsections 11.16 to 11.28 highlight the elements of the Guidance that are most relevant with respect to this application. This is not exhaustive and the guidance should be considered fully prior to making decisions with respect to applications.

## **9.0 Committee**

Each application must be considered on its own merits and any conditions attached to licences and certificates must be tailored to the individual style and characteristics of the premises and events concerned. This is essential to avoid the imposition of disproportionate and overly burdensome conditions on premises where there is no need for such conditions. Standardised conditions should be avoided and indeed, may be unlawful where they cannot be shown to be necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives in any individual case. Any action taken in relation to the application should be appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives and proportionate to the problems giving rise to the review.

On behalf of the Chief Officer of Northamptonshire Police Mr ADDERLEY, I call for Review of the Premises Licence under the Licensing Objectives of the Prevention of Crime and Disorder, Public Safety and the Protection of Children from Harm.

This review is being applied for following a series of stepped approach meetings that have been held with the current operators of Passion.

The current person on the Premises Licence and Designated Premises Supervisor for Passion is a male named Akhtar JANJUA however he is not currently involved in the business beyond being the landlord for the current operator Cleveland WALFALL. This has been the case since May 2016 and despite several attempts to meet with Mr Janjua during this time, he has always declined to meet with Police instead deferring to Mr WALFALL as the person in charge.

The Police believe that it is this lack of a person legally accountable having day to day control over the business that is contributing to some of the other concerns that the Police have with the current operation of the premises.

During the course of 2018, there have been several incidents that have taken place at the premises that, if taken on their own, would not necessarily have led to a review application. Taken together however, they paint a picture of a poorly run premises that is undermining the Licensing Objectives.

The first incident of note took place on the 17<sup>th</sup> June 2018. During this incident, the premises was holding an events night and had attracted a crowd of approximately 300 people. When the premises closed, these people were put out onto the street with no dispersal plan or supervision in place and as a result, a large number of police

officers were required to attend to disperse the crowd for approximately 40 minutes with no support or action from the venue staff. The attending Inspector described the behaviour of the crowd as hostile and extremely anti-police and that there would have been arrests made had there been any custody space to do so. As it was, one male was arrested and charged with an assault on a female who sustained a black eye and no support from staff at the premises.

On the 15<sup>th</sup> July 2018, Northants Police investigated two sexual assaults on two young females one of who was only 17yrs old and the other only just 18yrs old. On this occasion neither female had been subject to any form of ID checks despite being very young looking. They had both reported drinking alcohol in the venue and being befriended by male customers before leaving the venue in their company. This shows a lack of management direction when it comes to performing ID checks and a lack of staff awareness around vulnerability in the night time economy.

On the 24<sup>th</sup> November 2018 a visit to the premises was conducted in the early hours of the morning. As officers approached the premises, the smell of Cannabis emanating from inside was extremely strong and overpowering. When the door staff and the operator of the premises was spoken to about this, they all attempted to convince the attending officers that the smell was in fact incense that they were burning in the entryway however it was very clear that the incense was being used to try and mask the smell coming from inside. Although no walkthrough was conducted at the time of the visit. It was very clear that Class B drug use was taking place on the premises either with the knowledge or the consent of the operator.

On the 31<sup>st</sup> December 2018, two visits were conducted at the premises. During the first visit, the attending officer described the males on the door as being very anti-police and that they refused to speak to the officers. They also stated that there were no door staff on duty at the time of their visit.

A short time later other officers attended in order to try and establish how many people were present inside. Officers were again faced with people that refused to engage with them and describe the staff as evasive. They also state that they were told that the licence holder was not present despite it being apparent that the operator was present earlier. They also noted that a male they recognise and who does not hold an SIA licence was working as a door man on the door however when he saw officers, he has quickly taken off the jacket and run inside. The officer finally noted that one of the other males on the door who was directing people is heavily linked to drug supply and possession.

The Police believe that a review is necessary in order to establish who is legally responsible for this premises. It is clear that whoever is currently responsible for it is undermining the licensing objectives and that measures need to be put into place in the form of conditions to ensure that the management practices at the premises are fit for purpose.

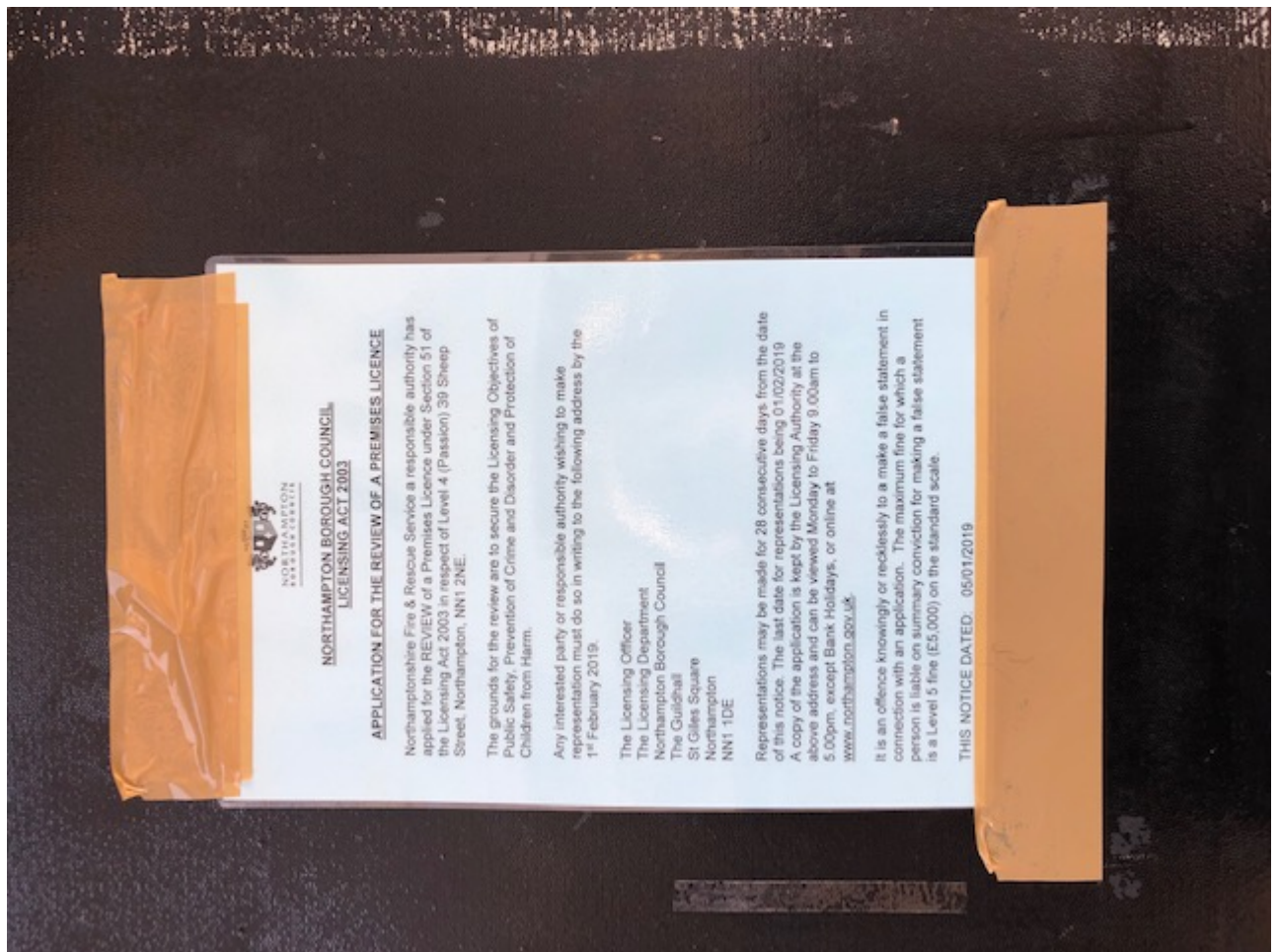
