- determining a better understanding of the complex nature of Sheltered Housing

The Task and Finish Group will take into consideration the six equality strands (age, gender, sexual orientation, religious beliefs, disabilities and ethnic origin).

Details of Sheltered Housing and housing options for older people could affect many residents of Northampton in someway.

As part of this piece of scrutiny work, the Task and Finish Group will look at the Borough's processes and policies in relation to sheltered housing to ascertain whether it is consistent with best practice. Short research has indicated that at the present time there does not appear to have been an Equality Impact Assessment undertaken for this Sheltered Housing accommodation. However, it is noted that it is intended that a full EIA will be produced and this will indicate that issues have been investigated at regional level.

As an Equality Impact Assessment for Sheltered Housing within the borough has not as yet been undertaken, within the Committee's report it could suggest that any impact on the six equality strands be taken into account.

The purpose of the Review is:

This Review could have adverse and positive impact on the six equality strands. However, as no Equality Impact Assessment has been completed yet, its impact on these groups has not been subject to a detailed level of scrutiny. The Task and Finish Group will be mindful of the six strands when undertaking its Scrutiny Review so that any recommendations that it makes can identify potential positive and negative impacts on any particular sector of the community. In terms of the working of the Task and Finish and its impact on the equality strands, paper copies of the agenda for the meetings of this Committee were issued to all Members of the Council, relevant officers and anyone else who is on the distribution list. As Task and Finish Group meetings are not held in public electronic versions of the agenda were not issued to a wider circulation including, the local press and radio. However the Task and Finish Group will, as part of its evidence gathering, meet with representatives of the Council's forums and sheltered housing tenants. The meetings will be held in easily accessible rooms and provision will be made for transport for those who require it. Provision has been made for attendees who have a disability, e.g. the documents are written in 12scale font for those who may suffer from a visual impairment, the blind have access to 'talking' documents, those whose first language is not English have access to translation services and the building in which the meetings will occur contain hearing loops and are accessible by those with severe mobility issues, such as wheel chair users.

The meeting with the Council's Forums was set at a time that is known to be suitable to those who will be attending. The meeting with the Sheltered Housing tenants has been set for 6pm in the evening, but transport will be provided to those requiring it. Provision will be made for those not able to attend this meeting to send in their views or to provide them over the telephone.
