Centre for Public Scrutiny

(CfPS) - Good Scrutiny Awards 2013

Overview and Scrutiny at Northampton was shortlisted for an award as part of the Centre for Public Scrutiny's (CfPS) Good Scrutiny Awards 2013 under the category transforming services for its Review - Managing Community Centres.

Details of this in-depth Scrutiny Review are published on the website.

The judges thought that this work, which facilitated the transfer of a large number of community facilities from council to community control, demonstrated the contribution that scrutiny can make to implementing a key government policy around community asset transfer successfully at local level.

How are Scrutiny Reviews carried out?

Scrutiny Panel Reviews are selected from issues which the Overview and Scrutiny Committee considers important to the people of Northampton. Scrutiny Panels are led by non-Executive Councillors.

Often individuals and representatives of organisations, who have expertise or have expressed an interest in a particular subject, are co-opted to the Scrutiny Panel for the life of the Review.

Scrutiny Panels are responsible for managing each Review by gathering and taking evidence. At the end of the Review they present their findings to the Overview and Scrutiny Committee for approval. The report is then presented to Cabinet for its consideration and feedback.

Scrutiny Activity for 2013/2014

The Overview and Scrutiny work programme for 2013/2014 was recently approved and the following in-depth reviews are now underway are: -

The Overview and Scrutiny Annual Report 2012/2013 has recently been published and details the good work undertaken by the Scrutiny Committees and its Scrutiny Panels last year.

A snapshot of the good work during 2012/2013: -

- A number of Councillors, who are not members of the Overview and Scrutiny Committee joined the membership of the Scrutiny Panels
- Overview & Scrutiny for Northampton Borough Council continues to show great interest and commitment to Community Safety/Crime and Disorder. The Committee has focused on crime and disorder issues from a public perspective and has worked in partnership with other agencies such as Northamptonshire Police on its Review: Serious acquisitive crime, violent crime and community safety.
